RESIGNATION OF MICHAEL WALSH IEB VICE PRESIDENT & TREASURER FINANCES

Resignation of Vice President & Treasurer Finances Michael Walsh and Announcement of Online World Congress with elections on 7 December 2024

Our esteemed colleague, Mr Michael Walsh, who has served as Vice President on the International Executive Board (IEB) since his election at the World Congress in October 2023 and as Treasurer Finances since November 2019, has decided to step down from his position due to the increasing demands of his new private venture. Mr Walsh formally announced his resignation on 20 August 2024, exactly four weeks before the start of the 2024 World Congress in Ohrid, North Macedonia, in September 2024.



Procedures for Filling the Vacancy

In accordance with the International Statutes and International Rules of the IPA, if a position becomes vacant within the first three years of the term, the designated Alternate assumes the role until the next IPA World Congress, where an election is held. Should the vacancy occur in the fourth year of the term, the Alternate remains in the position until the elective World Congress at the end of the term.

Given that Mr Walsh's resignation falls within the first year of his term and considering the proximity of the upcoming World Congress in Ohrid, the IEB has decided to hold an Online World Congress with elections on 7 December 2024 to elect a new Treasurer Finances and a new Vice President.

Justification for an Online Congress

To ensure that the election of a new Treasurer Finances and Vice President is conducted properly, with adequate time for nominations and preparation, the IEB has determined that an Online World Congress is the most practical solution. This approach allows us to adhere to the principles outlined in the statutes while ensuring that the leadership transition occurs smoothly and in a timely manner.

Election Procedures and Important Deadlines

The role of Treasurer Finances is critical to the financial health and integrity of the IPA, and it requires a person with substantial experience in managing financial responsibilities. Ideally, the candidate should have previous experience as a Treasurer within their National Section, as this will provide them with the necessary background and understanding to manage the finances of the IPA on an international level. This experience is essential to ensure that the IPA's financial operations are handled with the utmost professionalism and efficiency.

RESIGNATION OF MICHAEL WALSH IEB VICE PRESIDENT & TREASURER FINANCES

Please be aware of the following key dates for the upcoming election process:

Nominations Deadline:

All nominations for the position of Treasurer Finances and the Vice President must be submitted to the IAC iac@ieb-ipa.org no later than 8 September 2024. The role of Vice President is available to one of the elected IEB members or to the newly appointed Treasurer Finances. Nominations must be supported by the candidate's National Section and accompanied by a written consent from the candidate.

Agenda Publication:

The agenda for the Online World Congress, including the list of candidates, will be circulated to all sections by 18 October 2024.

Amendments to Motions:

Any amendments to motions must be submitted by 17 November 2024. The final list of candidates and any submitted amendments will be distributed to all sections on this date.

Online World Congress:

The Online World Congress will be held on 7 December 2024, during which the elections for Treasurer Finances and the new Vice President will take place.

Importance of Participation

Active participation in this process is crucial for the future leadership of the IPA. We urge all sections to engage fully in the nomination and election process, ensuring that we elect individuals who will continue to uphold the values and mission of our association.

Furthermore, I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Mr Walsh for his dedication and contributions to the IPA over the years. His departure from the IEB will be deeply felt, but we respect his decision and wish him every success in his future endeavours. Mr Walsh will remain in role and continue his duties for both Vice President and Treasurer Finances until 31st December 2024 to ensure a smooth transition and adequate handover period.

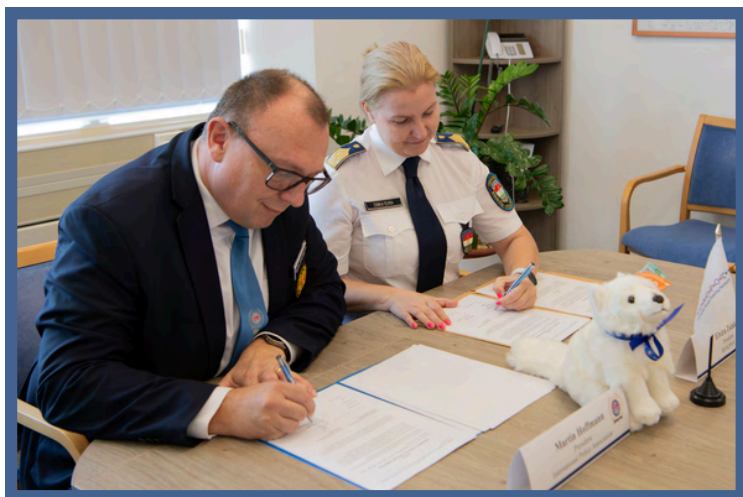

- ROADPOL will be invited to one of the next IPA International World Congresses to present ROADPOL to the international IPA Sections.
- ROADPOL and IPA to publicise the signing of the MoU on social media, in their newsletters and on the website.
- IPA will offer the opportunity to promote road safety on its Facebook page or in its monthly newsletter.

- ROADPOL will contact the President of IPA to arrange an interview for their newsletter.
- We will jointly explore the possibility of closer co-operation with the Dubai Police.
- After the election of a new President of ROADPOL in October 2024, a follow-up meeting with the new President will be scheduled in 2025.

YOUNG POLICE OFFICERS SEMINAR AUSTRIA 2024



YPOS 2024 hosted by IPA Section Austria Vienna, Austria – 29.07.2024 – 03.08.2024

The Young Police Officers Seminar or YPOS for 2024 was hosted by Section Austria and took place in Vienna over 5 days. 39 delegates from 26 IPA Sections worldwide took part in the programme which was a rich mix of policing, culture and social activity – from specialised units & firearms to operational policing, sport and rowing races and chances to see the capital sights and buildings of state and not forgetting the social aspect where the delegates had an opportunity to exchange experiences with their colleagues from around the World. The opening ceremony, addressed by International President Martin Hoffmann, Section Austria President Robert Neumann and led by Vice President Wolfgang Gabrutsch, set the tone for an unforgettable event.



The programme, devised by Section Austria, saw the professional aspects take place mostly at the Rossauer Barracks and here the delegates were introduced to the professional function of the International Police Association and the IPA Academy of Section Austria. Talks on Operational Policing functions of the Federal Police of Austria were given and were of great interest. During the course of the programme WEGA, K9 and COBRA units also engaged the delegates with displays of their operational functions and delegates in turn participated in physical training exercises to include wall climbing, firearms and obstacle courses.

As an IPA led event and a project which falls under the Professional Commission, a critical aspect of YPOS was the familiarisation of the delegates with the International Police Association and welcoming their views and input. The Strategic Young Members Conference – previously a stand-alone event – was incorporated to the YPOS programme and ran for a full day on August 1st. Facilitated by Fabian Payr (Section Austria) and Joyce O’ Grady (Section Ireland) and observed by President of Section Austria – Robert Neumann and International Professional Commission Chair – Diego Trolese. A series of talks and workshops yielded informative and in some cases, new points of view – crucial information in considering the direction of the YPOS movement going forward. This group, representative of Young Police Officers globally, were enthusiastic and engaged in strategies concerned with the growth of the Association. A new Programme for Education – the Young Police Officers Mentoring Programme, a live Section Ireland initiative, was presented for consideration by the delegates. This combines Education and Mentoring for Young Police Officers which will produce candidates who are informed in all aspects of IPA and the means to take that knowledge anywhere. Strong interest was expressed in taking part if this was offered in their home Sections.

As with every IPA event, the cultural and social aspects play a huge role and this was certainly the case with YPOS where Friendship is the vital link.

A Section Austria’s programme of social and cultural events were relaxed and engaging – from sightseeing Vienna on a walking tour to a reception at the Rathaus of Vienna and the honour of meeting local representatives of the Government were two highlights. A football game and a dragon boat race gave the group the chance to work as teams and added another unique opportunity to engage. The attention to detail by Section Austria was apparent and the appreciation of the delegates was clear. The end of the week saw a very different group dynamic where new and strong friendships had been very clearly established.

IPA UK JOURNEY TO SOUTH AFRICA



In July 2018, I chaired the Police Street Survival Course in Gimborn, an annual training event where the Defensive Tactics Group (IPA-DTG) teaches essential skills to officers from around the globe. This course draws delegates from diverse backgrounds, ages, ranks, and experiences, fostering a unique environment of learning and camaraderie. It was here that I met Lieutenant Colonel Hien Shultz, a helicopter pilot in the South African Police Service (SAPS). Our shared dedication to law enforcement and personal safety sparked a friendship, culminating in an invitation to teach self-defence in South Africa. Despite various delays—work, COVID, and personal circumstances—it took me six years to finally make the journey. This is the story of that unforgettable experience.

The plan to visit South Africa was set a year prior, by planning a vacation with my wife. However, it didn't take her long for her to realise that the primary reason for our trip was to connect with Hein and conduct two days training! Hein, proved to be an exceptional host, greeting us at Johannesburg airport and welcoming us into his home in Pretoria and making my wife feel safe. We were also introduced to his wonderful partner Mariska who is a serving officer in SAPS.

Among our sightseeing adventures, was a visit to the Koevoet Memorial at the Voortrekker Monument, Pretoria.

This was dedicated to the Police Officers who died during the insurgency bush wars of 1979–89. Now sadly their sacrifice forgotten and only remembered by the few who were there. Another poignant visit was to the Police Memorial wall at the Union Buildings. Shockingly the wall rapidly fills with the names of over 100 officers per year who die in the line of duty each year. This sobering moment underscored the critical importance of our work in the IPA-DTG—not just as a professional outlet, but as a vital means of enhancing officer safety.



On our fourth day, we arrived at the beautiful IPA House (Johann Rissik House) in Pretoria, where I was to teach self-defence skills to police and IPA members. The turnout was impressive, with about 30 participants, mostly retirees but also some active officers. We began with a customary minute of silence for fallen and injured officers worldwide. I then gave an hour-long presentation on the DTG, emphasising our reality-based training, taught by police officers for police officers. The techniques are designed to be easy to learn, mastered, and remembered under stress. The training includes open-handed strikes, knife defence, stopping critical bleeding, and ground defence. By the end of the day, everyone was injury-free and thoroughly enjoyed the session having learnt something (I hope!)

IPA UK JOURNEY TO SOUTH AFRICA

We were joined by the IPA President of South Africa, Mr. 'Vossie' Vos, who presented certificates of attendance and expressed support for forming a DTG within the section. Hein and Robert Coetzee volunteered to lead this initiative, and several attendees applied to join the IPA, marking it a successful event. The day concluded with a traditional South African "braai" (BBQ), where we enjoyed a delicious spread, replenished our fluids and made new friends.

After another pleasing day with Hein, we embarked on a four-day safari in the Klaserie Private Reserve, part of the Greater Kruger National Park. This unforgettable adventure deserves its own story, but suffice it to say, it was a trip of a lifetime. We then flew to Cape Town for the second training event at the IPA House, Timour Hall Villa, in the scenic Constantia Valley. This venue, with its stunning surroundings and excellent bar, is highly recommended for anyone visiting South Africa.



The training in Cape Town mirrored the Pretoria course but catered to a different audience. This time, 50 mostly active SAPS and Metro police officers, including the Executive Director (Safety & security) Vincent Botto and the Commissioner (Public Safety) Petrus Roberts. The session began with a particularly sombre minute of silence, as one of their officers had been murdered the day before, highlighting the extreme dangers faced by SAPS officers daily. Despite the heat, everyone trained hard, motivated and eager to learn. Many were inspired to join the IPA, further expanding our network. Although I was exhausted by the end of the day, I was gratified to know I had contributed to their safety.

The evening was spent replenishing fluids at the bar and listening to incredible stories of near-death experiences and heroic deeds—far from the usual mundane conversations about the weather or economic woes of the UK.

Leaving South Africa was bittersweet. It's a land of contrasts—dangerous yet stunningly beautiful, with amazing wildlife but, most importantly, the warm-hearted and generous people I met. I would like to thank everyone I met and particularly Vossie and Jakkie who helped facilitate the visit. I am especially grateful to Hein and Mariska for their hospitality and friendship. I look forward to our next meeting and continuing our mission to enhance officer safety.

IPA ALBANIA RETIREMENT CEREMONY



IPA Section Albania in respect of the work, dedication and sacrifices of the State Police employees on 25.07. 2024 organised in the city of Shkodra a ceremony for the retirement of Chief Commisar Pashko Lakaj, who since 1983 has served without interruption in the structures of the border police in Shkodra. In this ceremony, in addition to former employees of the State Police who have retired, colleagues of Mr. Pashko, leaders of the Municipality and the Prefecture also take part.

Part of the greeting:

Dear friends, participating ladies and gentlemen,

Your presence is a testimony of appreciation of the year-long work, commitment and sacrifices of State Polie employees. Institutionalising retirement is not simply a procedure to fill the reservoir of a lifetime with positive emotions.

Normally, people ask what special thing did Chief Pashko Lakaj do to inspire us. There are numerous moral principles and ethical values that characterised his career. You know that better than me, anyway I would like to call you attention to certain phenomena beyond the case "Pashko". We rightly dedicate due care to special ceremonies, related to heroic deeds, affecting the life and health of policemen, whereas retirement because of age is a daily calendar act.

We know the number of policemen killed in line of duty, but we do not know how many of their colleagues celebrated the birthday with a 65- number candle on top of the cake.

One thing is certain, very few, if any, policemen enjoy their retirement over as many years as their work period. From then on things will change; wakening up, morning coffee with your colleagues, work hours, complex situations, frequent phone calls, correspondence or meetings will be replaced with coffees at the neighbourhood bar, petty talk about day politics with friends and neighbours, sitting at home in front of TV or with the cell phone at hand, checking every evening to switch off the light and water taps and carry out the tasks your wife asked you for.

IPA Japan holds 2024 National Congress in Hokkaido

On July 20-21, IPA Japan held its 2024 National Congress at a hot spring resort in Sapporo, Hokkaido, northern Japan. IPA SPAIN TACTICAL POLICE CONGRESS

- IPA Spain, through its IPA Avila group, organises the second edition of this Police Congress, which is getting bigger every year.

- Registrations had to be closed in less than 4 minutes from the opening due to more than 400 registrations, having only 250 places available.

- This year, 24 instructors from the IPA Tactical Police group attended the congress and it was finally possible to increase the number of participants to 300.

The second edition of the International Congress of the IPA Tactical Police Group of Spain took place on the 6th of April in the National Police School of the city of Avila.



Two consecutive years organising an event where seminars and lectures on police intervention are held. Always looking for the best training for our police officers, tools are used to carry out their work professionally, safely and efficiently, and in accordance with the laws in force.

The reason for organising this event is to provide a meeting point for all police officers in Spain interested in training in police operations from a professional and technical point of view. It is aimed at professionals who patrol the streets on a daily basis.

To this end, the IPA Tactical Police Instructors have the most complete curriculums of those presented from all the Autonomous Communities belonging to IPA Spain. And following the motto that gives meaning to IPA "Servo per Amikeco", this event was totally free for all the attendees.

The morning started with the presentation of the Congress, taking the floor first of all Mr. José R. Madera, Secretary of IPA Ávila and in representation of the National Police School, inaugurated the Congress, thanking the School and its Management for opening its doors to this second edition. He also thanked the sponsors who made it possible for the event to go ahead with their contributions, and all those present for their confidence in the IPA. Finally, he reminded everyone of the internal rules of the School so that the event could run as smoothly as possible. The President of IPA Avila, Mr. David Lopez, then continued by briefly informing what the International Police Association is all about, thanking the other speakers at the opening table for their hard work in coordinating and organising the Congress, and finally he gave a brief presentation of the seminars and talks and how they would be developed.

He ended by giving the floor to the IPA Avila Training member Mr. Santiago Jimenez who informed about the IPA Tactical Police group, encouraging those present to have a good time and to make an effort to take advantage of the great training experience of the Instructors who would be giving the seminars. Finally, Mr. Ángel Cantalapiedra, president of IPA Castile and León, spoke on behalf of the entire Delegation to which he belongs, and presented the Secretary of the IPA Ávila with a medal of thanks to the Management of the National Police School for their involvement in the Congress.

The event was organised in training blocks where all attendees attended a 3-hour seminar in the morning and a different one in the afternoon. It was coordinated in blocks so that the training received in the morning could be continued in the afternoon. In this way, 6 simultaneous training blocks were organised with a minimum of 2 instructors per seminar, as follows:

In the morning, the following seminars are held: Health Tactics, Handling of short weapons, Handling of extendable police batons and shackles, Transition of weapons, Non-lethal means of arrest and Entry and search.

In the afternoon, the following seminars were held: Progression in CQB buildings, Intervention in vehicles, Self-protection, Arrest techniques, Reduction of violent persons, Intervention with a knife, Blackman and Tactical pen.

The morning and the afternoon were headed by two lectures, "Detention practice" in the morning and "Stress in armed interventions" in the afternoon, where thanks to the capacity of the colossal Auditorium of the National Police School all attendees were able to attend at the same time. The afternoon presentation brought one of the emotional moments of the day, with the intervention of Carlos, Mosso D'Escuadra, who was shot in the line of duty in his forearm during an armed intervention. The attendees asked numerous questions from which it was possible to draw the conclusion that a good job is being done with the organisation of this Congress and the training provided. In addition, Carlos, as a final conclusion, claimed that it was precisely more training for our police officers that should be demanded, for more and more frequent cases where the integrity of those who act or that of the citizens to be protected is at stake.

As an anecdote, it should be noted that the expectation in this Congress was such that, in less than 4 minutes from the opening of registration, the 300 places of the maximum capacity available were filled. This year there were more IPA members from all over Spain who travelled to Avila to attend the event, exactly 48 IPA members, some of whom travelled more than 1000 kilometres to attend the Congress. The rest were students from the School who are training to join the National Police. In addition, this Congress has tripled the number of students who become members and want to belong to



this great IPA family, benefiting from the advantages of belonging to the largest Police Association in the world. The closing ceremony took place at 9 p.m. in the Auditorium where different raffles were held by our sponsors who gave away products and products of the brands they represented. 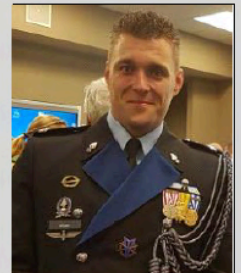

IPA BELGIUM TRIP AROUND THE BALTIC SEA

From 14 to 25.06.2024, the IPA section of the province of Liège (IPA Liège) Belgium made a magnificent trip around the Baltic Sea: 7 countries by plane, bus, cruise and ... on foot (more than 90km to our credit!) What an exploit and what wonders!

Sweden, Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Poland and Denmark!

On June 14 we flew to Stockholm, a must visit of the maritime museum Vasa, one of the most visited museums in Scandinavia. The museum traces the history of the warship commanded by King Gustav II Adolphe, a three-masted built in the 17th century with its 64 guns, Engulfed by the sea in August 1628 after 15 minutes of navigation. Refloated in 1957, it has been meticulously reconstructed.



On 15.06, we made a panoramic tour of one of the most beautiful northern capitals : Stockholm: the Royal Castle, the old town, etc...

At 4pm we boarded the cruise ship «Serenade» of the Tallink Silja Line to Helsinki. Aperitifs, dinners, orchestras and shops: A true shopping centre on the Baltic Sea. After a «white» night at 2am we were able to admire a beautiful sunset over the sea.

On 16.06, arrival in Helsinki, the capital of Finland. Visit the Senate Square, the Cathedral, the Sibelius Monument and after dinner we wandered on the Esplanade, real «Champs Elysées» of Helsinki... We had the opportunity to meet a delegation of the IPA from Estonia composed of Mrs Sigrít HANG, member of the National Executive Committee; Mr Kostja LEPIK, member of IPA Estonia and Mrs Liivika TOMING from the Estonian Academy of Security Sciences (Sisekaitseakadeemia): charming evening in their company...

On 17.06 we visited the Old Town of Tallinn. Afterwards, departure towards Parnu, before entering Latvia, on 18.06, at Riga, capital and located on the Baltic Sea, at the mouth of the Daugava.

Rundale Castle, located in the Zemgale region of southern Latvia is a remarkable example of baroque and rococo architecture in Latvia. Its construction began in 1736, under the direction of the Italian architect Francesco Bartolomeo Rastrelli, known for his work on the Winter Palace in Saint Petersburg.

Continuation of our trip in Lithuania we made a small stop at the Hill of the Crosses of Siauliai, north of Lithuania, with more than 150,000 crosses ranging from the smallest crucifix to gigantic calvary erected in memory of martyrs and heroes of national independence: It is a high place of pilgrimage.



We had the opportunity to meet, in the evening, a delegation of IPA Lithuania composed of Vytautas JASIULEVICIUS, Secretary General of IPA Lithuanian Section and chairman of the National Internal Commission, Mrs Giedrė TAMULIONIENE, high Superintendent, member of the Board of the Police Department Subdivision, working in the International Relations Board, Interpol Division and Mr Sergei SANKOVSKI, member of the Board of the Public Security Service Branch. Very friendly meeting and good contacts for the future for our international IPA relationship between Belgium and Lithuania...



21.06, departure towards Kaunas. Kaunas is the second largest city in Lithuania and the most important river port in the Baltic states. After dinner, we continued our journey to Masuria in Kętrzyn in Poland where we visited the Wolfsschanze (in French: «la Tanière du Loup») Code name for the main headquarters of Adolf Hitler during World War II, the Wolf's Lair housed the headquarters of the Eastern Front. Much of the complex was destroyed by the German army at the end of the war. Adolf Hitler spent more than 800 days in the Wolfsschanze, where his most paranoid ideas such as the extermination of Jews and the total destruction of Warsaw after the 1944 uprising" according to guide Jerzy Szykowski.

It was also in the Wolfsschanze that the attempt on Hitler's life took place on 20 July 1944. Its instigator, Count von Stauffenberg, was executed with three other conjurers that evening.

22.06: After lunch we drive to Olsztyn and Malbork. Capital of the Teutonic state from 1309 to 1457, Malbork transports us into medieval Poland, the castle is the largest medieval fortress in Europe. It is also the largest brick building in the world.

On 23.06, guided tour of Gdansk, the pearl of the Baltic in Poland. Old Hanseatic city. Gdansk – formerly known by its German name of Danzig – is a beautiful city rich in centuries-old history. In the centre of its main town, rebuilt after the Second World War, stand the colourful facades of the Long Market, which today houses shops and restaurants. Nearby is the bronze statue of Neptune, the Roman god of the sea, a symbol of the city dating back to the 17th century. Gdańsk is also the center of world trade in amber.

Gdansk was also the cradle of popular struggle against the communist regime and the movement Solidarność led by the electrician Lech Wałęsa. The European Centre of Solidarność, is a multimedia museum housed in a contemporary building of 3000 m² covered with steel, at the site of the shipyards where it all began.



At the end of the day, we board the Stena Line Ferry for our night cruise to Karlskrona in Sweden... From there, on the coach ride to Malmö known for its modern decor, illustrated by its twisted skyscraper, the Turning Torso, a masterpiece of contemporary architecture.

The Øresund bridge, with its island and tunnel extension, connects the cities of Malmö in Sweden and Copenhagen in Denmark.

Arrival in Copenhagen, capital of Denmark. The historic centre of the city contains an 18th century rococo district called Frederiksstad: here you will find the Amalienborg Palace, royal residence.

The Little Mermaid

One of the most popular icons in Denmark, the Little Mermaid, first appeared in the famous fairy tale by Hans Christian Andersen and gained even wider recognition with the animated adaptation of Disney in 1989. A statue of the character, created by artist Edvard Eriksen, overlooks the port of Copenhagen and is one of the city's most popular tourist attractions.

IPA GERMANY VISIT KODOKAN JAPAN



On August 6, an IPA Germany member, Mr. Daniel Tobias Schubert who works at the Dortmund headquarters of the North Rhine-Westphalia State Police and his friend Annika visited the Kodokan Judo Institute, the birthplace of judo. The visit was at the request of Daniel who had started practicing judo in his home country about six months earlier.

The Kodokan was founded in 1882 by Master Jigoro Kano, the founder of Judo, and is now located in Bunkyo Ward, Tokyo. That evening, I met them at the entrance to the building and first paid our respects to the statue of Master Kano outside. Then we went to the observation seats on the 8th floor and watched the training in the main dojo on the 7th floor. It was during the annual summer training period and many judoka including people from overseas, women and children were there with the presence of Mr. Haruki Uemura, Director of the Kodokan. Daniel seemed so fascinated by the judo movement in front of him and asked me some questions about throwing techniques. There were also foreign tourists in the seats, which showed the high interest in one of the Japanese martial arts. On the first floor, there is a shop that sells judo-related items, and on that day, many judo enthusiasts were shopping there, including Daniel.



Daniel and Annika's visit to the Kodokan ended after about an hour. As I am also a 6th Dan judoka and train there, I'd like to meet him on the tatami mat next time.

Lastly, IPA Judoka who are interested in training or observing at the Kodokan are welcome to contact me at toruuto06@gmail.com. I will strive to see that your requests are fulfilled. A certain level of judo experience is required to train there, and you need to become a Kodokan member, but there are no special requirements for observing.

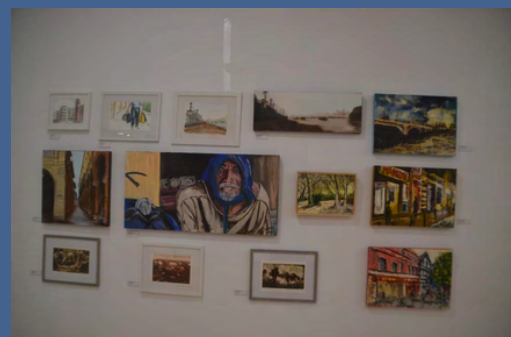

The exhibition was inaugurated on June 15 at 12:00 by Mr. Fernando Jesús Manzano Pedrera, General Secretary of the Interior, Emergencies and Civil Protection of the Government of Extremadura, Ms. Elisabeth Martín Declares, Deputy Delegate of Tourism and Youth on behalf of the President of the Provincial Council of Cáceres Mr. Miguel Ángel Morales Sánchez and by Mr. Antonio Jesús Gómez Montejano, President of IPA Spain, with the assistance of the National Treasurer Mr. José Guillermo Rubio Chinchurreta, in addition to the president of IPA Extremadura, Coordinator of the Cultural Commission Mr. Antonio José Cabello Garay, and several members of the Board of Directors of IPA Extremadura.

The national police, civil guards and local/municipal police who participate in this meeting come from Andalusia, the Community of Madrid, Extremadura, La Rioja and the Valencian Community, mainly writers, painters, photographers and police model makers.

Regarding the Extremaduran participation, there are artists from the National Police of Cáceres and Mérida, the Civil Guard of Badajoz and Cáceres, as well as the Local Police of Almendralejo, Cáceres, Guareña and Mérida, as well as a representation of the Customs Surveillance Service of Cáceres.

The participation of the Cáceres Local Police is materialized in a collection of six books written by its previous chief superintendent, who died in October 2021, Mr. Cesar García González, partner of IPA Extremadura, with the intention of paying a small tribute to his author.

Our thanks to his wife and son for lending these works for the exhibition and accompanying us at the inauguration.

The paintings on display use different techniques, acrylics, oils, watercolors, pen drawings, graphite and polychrome pencils, encaustic, rust... and different motifs. It is worth highlighting a set of 13 works that travel from Logroño to participate in the exhibition and another 8 from Colombia, as well as the collection of drawings by the artist José Manuel Otero, most of them police-themed portraits.

Among the books on display you can see both poetry and prose, fiction novels, crime novels, local history, contemporary fiction, historical books, self-help books, personal improvement books, technical books on practical police operations, research books, legends and even verses in Castúo, dialect spoken in some areas of the Extremadura region.

In the Malinche Room of the San Francisco de Cáceres Cultural Complex, provided by the Provincial Council, and in the Multipurpose Hall of the district of Novelda del Guadiana, Badajoz, a farce entitled "Reckless and Dancer" was performed that introduces messages about the prevention of accidents. Roads aimed at older people, written and represented by municipal police officers of Madrid.

As for photography, the six prizes from the XI IPA Spain National Photography Contest are on display, three in the police category and three in the free category. A collection of 8 images related to dance and a photograph presented by a young promise of the plastic arts, daughter of a member of IPA Extremadura.

Many of these encounters have resulted in life-long friendships. Read below the testament from Joseph Carr, IPA USA during his visit to the UK.



"I have just returned from a trip to the UK, and had the pleasure of meeting Ned Donovan from the Metropolitan Police. Ned was gracious enough to provide a tour of New Scotland Yard and we were able to trade stories. It was interesting to see how things are different (but also kind of the same!) There are other options available for UK visitors as well, such as the IPA night at the Ceremony of the Keys on Tuesdays. Highly recommend that law enforcement officers planning travel consider the benefits of the IPA. I'd also suggest reaching out as soon as possible, preferably even before you settle on dates and arrangements, because you may want to incorporate possibilities from the IPA into your plans."

IPA UK EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

Earlier this year the 9 Region committee of IPA UK took on the challenge of designing and delivering a Police Officer Exchange Programme with aim of hosting a total of 12 serving officers from across four nations putting this event on a much larger scale than any previous exchange event our team has delivered to international visitors.

After much planning our exchange event began on Monday 15th July 2024 where delegates from Switzerland, Germany, Ireland and the Netherlands travelled to London to meet at midday. Once gathered the group were welcomed at the British Transport Police Digital Investigations Centre in Chelsea by the 9 Region Chair and Secretary along with members of the BTP Branch who delivered an induction to the exchange programme.



BTP Branch member Detective Inspector Babatunde Adeyeye then delivered an input on the British Transport Police before taking the delegates on a tour of the Digital Investigations Centre where they were able to see the importance of CCTV within British policing and investigations.

On day 2 the group met bright and early in Westminster where they were also joined by Sussex Branch member Christine Clack. The first item of the day was visiting the Metropolitan Police Mounted Unit at Great Scotland Yard. They enjoyed a tour of unique facility and received an input on the specialist work that the unit does, and of course they got to meet the wonderful police horses.

It was then time for some tourism, our guides took the delegates on a whistle stop tour which included the Household Cavalry, Downing Street, the houses of parliament, Westminster Abbey, and Buckingham palace before stopping for a much-needed lunch.

It was back to business after lunch as the group met the British Transport Police Civil Protection Unit at Kings Cross where they were taught about the unique challenges that come with policing the London Underground.

Upon leaving Kings Cross we reverted to some more tourism in an effort of keeping a balanced itinerary first taking the group a 'proper English pub' at Blackfriars for a well-deserved drink. After which an afternoon stroll took place starting in the City of London which included St Paul's Cathedral, the monument to fire of London, the Tower of London, Tower Bridge and HMS Belfast.

Day 3 saw the group meet at the British Transport Police Specialist Operations Centre where a busy morning had been planned for them which included visits and inputs from the Dog Section, Counter Terrorism Unit, Firearms, and the Specialist Response Unit. After a break for lunch the group travelled to Waterloo to meet the Disruption Tasking Team and explore another big London railway station.

Jumping back onto the tube the group then travelled north to Wembley Park where they were welcomed by Section UK Vice President (Professional) Chris Duncombe who took them on a tour of a typical British Police Station. Accompanied by VP Duncombe, we then took the group to an IPA social event at Box Park which was held to mark their visit to London, the event was well attended by members of the BTP Branch who were delighted to meet our international visitors.

Day 4 was the final day of the exchange, after breakfast the group gathered at British Transport Police Force Headquarters for a presentation by their specialist drone unit, exploring the equipment and the capabilities used within this fast-evolving area of policing. The group enjoyed sharing their own experiences of policing with drones and comparing the devices and tactics used between their countries.

Due to the variety of departure times, it was then sadly time to begin saying goodbye to some of the delegates who embarked on their journey home.



IPA UK EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

By midday we were down to three remaining delegates from the Netherlands and Ireland. Despite being tired from their busy trip the remaining officers were insistently keen to see one last bit of policing before leaving the United Kingdom. At short notice we began exploring options for one last experience when with a stroke of luck, we received an invitation from BTP Branch member Amy Duckworth to attend a live multi agency operation at London Bridge. Upon arrival the delegates were taken back by the scale of the operation being carried out. The operation involved a total of over 100 officers comprising British Transport Police, Metropolitan Police, National Crime Agency and Immigration officers and their respective specialist teams. The delegates were taken on a tour of the live operation and even had the opportunity to chat to Chief Inspector in charge.

It was at London Bridge where we said goodbye to our remaining delegates which in turn marked the end of a very successful exchange event.



Despite the obvious complexities of delivering an event of this size the value achieved by successfully delivering this event was recognised and felt by all involved. Previously as a region we have delivered exchanges that involve 2-3 officers from one nation. In comparison however this year's exchange, not only enabled visitors to connect with our members, but also to meet members from the other participating national sections which enhanced the 'IPA experience' for all involved. We also noticed that this event generated a lot more awareness of the IPA and what we do across the forces involved with a larger multi-national group being more noticeable and sparking more interest. We are delighted to have already seen a positive impact from this successfully event and look forward to building on this platform moving forward into the future.

On behalf of 9 Region, I would like to thank each, and every individual involved who's support of this exchange enabled us to deliver a fantastic event. From the IPA members that hosted visitors in their homes to the many teams and units that allocated their time and opened their doors to our guests and all the friendly officers and staff that made our visitors feel welcome throughout their visit.

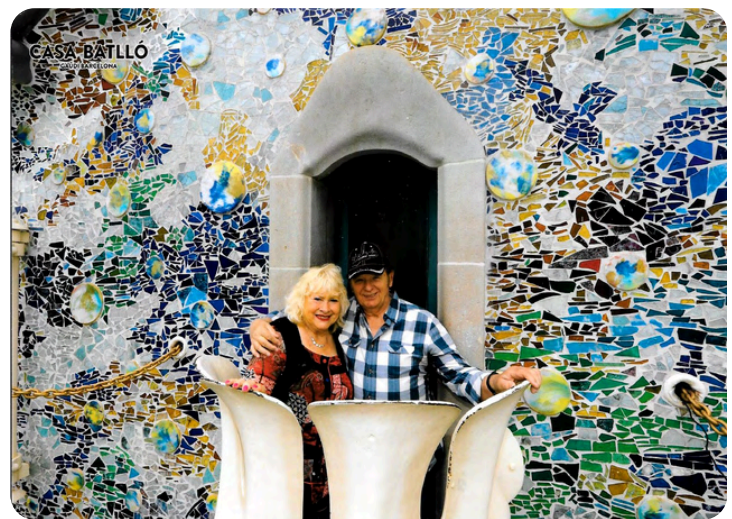
